CITY COUNCIL UPDATE MOUNT ROYAL

PROPOSED EMERGENCY 60 BED SHELTER

A VACANT LOT, LOCATED WITHIN THE CENTRAL INDUSTRIAL AREA IS THE PROPOSED SITE FOR A 60-BED ENHANCED EMERGENCY SHELTER OPERATED BY THE MUSTARD SEED. THE LAND AT 170, 31 ST. E. IS OWNED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN AND MEETS THE FOLLOWING SASKATOON CITY COUNCIL APPROVED CRITERIA:

- ROOM FOR APPROXIMATELY 60 BEDS
- BEDS IN AN OPEN SHELTER-TYPE HALL (WITH MOVABLE WALL SYSTEMS OR PARTITIONS)
- SHOWERS, BATHROOMS, KITCHEN
- INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL GATHERING SPACES (AMENITY SPACES) AVAILABLE ON SITE BE CONSIDERED
- ON FEBRUARY 28, 2024 CITY COUNCIL ALSO DIRECTED THAT ANY SITE BE AT LEAST 250 METRES FROM AN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN THE SASKATOON PUBLIC SCHOOL OR GREATER SASKATOON CATHOLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM.

THE GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN WILL LEAD THE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE ENHANCED

HARRY BAILEY AQUATIC UPDATE

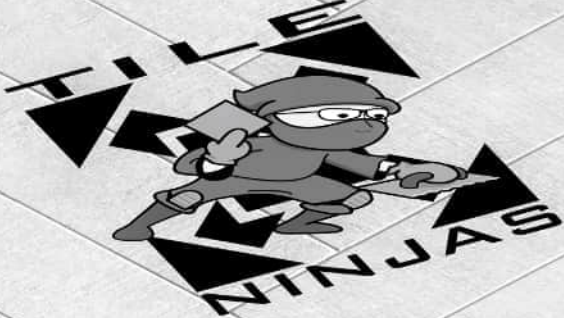
RENOVATION WORK AT THE HARRY BAILEY AQUATIC CENTRE CONTINUES TO MOVE FORWARD ON SCHEDULE. AS OF THE END OF JUNE, APPROXIMATELY 58% OF CONSTRUCTION IS COMPLETE AND THE PROJECT REMAINS ON TRACK FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION IN SPRING 2026. THE FACILITY IS EXPECTED TO FULLY REOPEN BY SEPTEMBER 1, 2026.

CURRENT PROGRESS:

- POOL & STRUCTURAL WORK – MAJOR REHABILITATION OF THE MAIN COMPETITION POOL IS UNDERWAY, INCLUDING NEW PIPING, SKIMMERS, WATERPROOFING AND THICK-SET TILE PREPARATION.
- MECHANICAL & ELECTRICAL UPGRADES (MECHANICAL ROOM & BASEMENT) – MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL UPGRADES CONTINUE, WITH NEW HEATING AND VENTILATION SYSTEMS BEING INSTALLED.

WHAT'S NEXT:

WORK WILL CONTINUE THIS SUMMER ON POOL SYSTEMS, MECHANICAL INSTALLATIONS AND INTERIOR FINISHES. PLANNING FOR FURNISHINGS, SIGNAGE AND IT SYSTEMS IS ALSO PROGRESSING TO ENSURE THE FACILITY IS FULLY PREPARED FOR REOPENING.

Message from Saskatoon Police Service Community Mobilization Unit

Greetings Mount Royal Community from the Saskatoon Police Service Community Mobilization Unit! Our unit was formally known as the Community Liaison Unit and we had three officers, each one dedicated to a specific area: Central, East and Northwest Division. We now have 6 officers and a Sergeant and soon to have 8 officers by October 1st, 2025! The expansion is new and exciting for our unit, we are utilizing the expansion to run "hot spot" operational plans to target criminal activity within the city of Saskatoon. Stay tuned for the announcement of your CMU Central Division officers.

What does this mean for your community? A dedicated team of officers that can address concerns directly in your district. Reporting of criminal and suspicious activity in your area is crucial to deterring crime and allocating resources to your community. Reported incidences of criminal activity are taken into consideration for current "op plans". The statistics from citywide criminal reporting is compiled and officers review crime stats mapping and identify "hot spot" locations and will determine the best ways to deter crime and affect arrests of perpetrators. Together we can make a difference in our city!

Reporting Options

If you are reporting an emergency, please dial 9-1-1.

The Saskatoon Police Service has three options for non-emergency reporting by the public:

1. Telephone

Utilize the Call Back Unit by calling 306-975-8300. You will be put on a call back list. The CBU will do its best to call you back within five calendar days.

2. Online

View the Online Reporting page to see if your report qualifies for online reporting and if so leave your report at your convenience.

3. In Person

Visit the SPS Service Centre seven days a week between 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. to leave your report in person. You have the option of virtually joining the line in the lobby from anywhere. Please visit the Service Centre - Lobby Management Service page for more information.

Some safety tips for the fall: a "buddy" system is a great way to stay safe out on the streets, and in our parks. Always make sure someone knows where you are, have a cell phone with you, if at all possible, when out walking in the community. The old adage "if you see something, say something" is so important! CARROT ZUCCHINI BREAD WITH CREAM CHEESE WALNUT FROSTING

INGREDIENTS

Carrot Zucchini Bread

- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 2 eggs
- 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1/4 cup pure maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 1/2 cups grated zucchini
- 1/2 cup shredded carrot
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts (optional)

Cream Cheese Walnut Frosting

- 4 ounces cream cheese softened
- 1/4 cup butter softened
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 tablespoon milk
- 1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 cup chopped walnuts (optional)

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Coat a 9 X 5 inch loaf pan with non-stick coating spray.
2. In medium bowl stir together flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, ginger and nutmeg. Set aside.
3. Add eggs and brown sugar to a large mixing bowl and beat with an electric mixer until smooth. Add oil, pure maple syrup, and vanilla, and mix again until well blended. Add about half of the flour mixture and mix just until incorporated. Add remaining flour mixture and continue to mix until combined. Using a wooden spoon, stir carrot and zucchini into the batter.
4. Pour batter into the prepared loaf pan. Bake 45 to 50 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in centre comes out clean. Let cool for 15 to 20 minutes before removing from pan. Allow to cool completely before frosting.
5. Meanwhile, prepare the frosting.
6. Use an electric mixer to beat cream cheese together with butter in a medium bowl. Add powdered sugar and mix again until incorporated. Add milk, lemon juice, and vanilla extract and beat until creamy.
7. Frost the cooled loaf of bread and immediately sprinkle with chopped walnuts, if desired.
